I plan, deliver, and assess library programs and services for education. I collaborate with a diverse group of faculty in developing course-integrated instruction. Primary responsibilities include instruction, reference and research support, and collection development.

I taught reading to seventh and eighth-grade students through a literature-based curriculum, aligned with district and state standards, that included intensive experiences reading YA novels, participation in literature circles, and opportunities for free voluntary reading.

In a cohort-based M.Ed. program, I taught the capstone experience, which included instruction in teacher research methodology and (concurrently) the direction of the applied project, a teacher research study carried out in the classroom.

I managed a circulating and reference collection of over 15,000 volumes, including 17 computers with database and Internet access. I also administered an annual budget of \$25,000. I provided professional development support to teachers. I also sponsored school library functions and provided extended hours for staff and students. From 2002 to 2004, I assisted in the architectural planning and execution of a total library remodel.
