Chapters are reminded that their annual reports, including the membership dues payments should be received by the AZSSAR Secretary-Treasurer no later than January 15, 2002. As the Arizona Society approaches the 400 membership mark, we should strive to minimize losses due to non-payment of dues. Over the last 15 years, AZSSAR's membership has been on a steady decline. Working together, we can turn that around in the new millennium.

Supplemental Applications Pour In
An unintended consequence of the

forthcoming (but now delayed) Supplemental Application fee increase was a tidal wave of Supplemental Applications submitted by members who had been "putting it off." AZSSAR has submitted around 20 supplemental applications since Thanksgiving. Congratulations and patience to those who submitted applications--based on the current backlog at National, it may take several months for the headquarters staff to work their way through the mountain of end-of-year submissions. To those who still are working on Supplemental Applications, the fee increased was delayed by at least six months so you still have time to make your submissions under the old fee schedule.

HOW TO EXPEDITE SAR APPLICATIONS

1. "Original" applications must be TYPED or Computer Generated using black ink on both sides of the SAR watermarked paper.
2. Submit 2 copies of the "Original"
3. Submit 2 sets of proofs
- 4 If DAR applications are submitted they must be "RECORD COPIES" obtained from NSDAR headquarters.
5. When "Family" Genealogies are submitted they must reference sources for the information used in the application. Be aware that the National Genealogist may request copies of such sources. For example: if a census is quoted National may want to see a copy of that census or if a family Bible is quoted National may want to see a copy of the entry referenced.
6. By all means refer to FORM 0912 "Preparation of Application Requirements", copies of which were mailed to all Chapter Registrars.

On a beautiful Chamber of Commerce day, the Palo Verde Chapter held its inaugural event in the Mesa Veterans Day Parade on 10 November 2001. And a wonderful day and event it was for our first outing!

In keeping with our Color Guard's selected 'theme' entitled "Keeping Alive The Spirit of '76", we decided to go beyond our own Chapter members and enlist the support of the Highland High School Air Force Junior ROTC, whose Senior Instructor is our fellow Palo Verde Compatriot, LTC Ed Fox.

World Class Revolutionary War Library. The new library will have a splendid courtyard dedicated to the original 13 colonies. This courtyard will consist of thousands of bricks. The cost per brick will be \$100 (tax deductible as a 501(c)(3) donation.
