Parking Lot Practice

Introduction

This series of articles will describe several exercises which you can practice by yourself or with a friend. The exercises will help you develop the skills you need. The proper execution of these exercises will help you in various traffic situations. Do not attempt these exercises unless you can already perform basic skills such as using the clutch and throttle correctly, shifting and riding in a straight line. If you do not have these basic skills, be sure to seek instruction before practicing the skills in this guide. Of course, the best place to learn to ride is in a quality rider education program, if one is located near you.

Read the entire guide before you practice. Take the guide with you for reference when you practice.

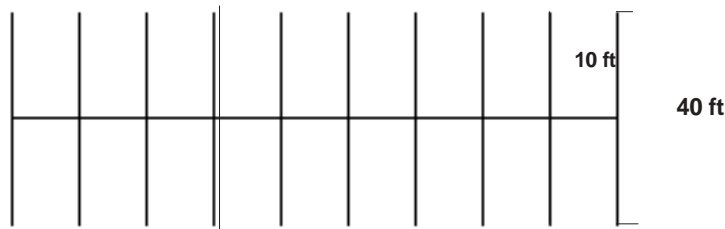
Keep practicing until you can do each exercise at least five times without a problem. Do not practice for more than one or two hours at a time. When you get tired, you cannot practice effectively.

Choosing a Practice Area

A well-marked parking lot is the best practice area. Be aware, however, of grease left by parked cars. Look for parking lots that are not used all the time at shopping centers, schools, churches or community centers. For instance, you might use a school lot in the evening hours, or a shopping center early in the morning.

Once you've selected a suitable location, it's important to gain permission from the owner.

Keep this basic parking lot diagram in mind when setting up drills and exercises.



If the parking lot you choose doesn't have lines, use the dimensions diagrammed here. Mark them using a tape measure and chalk.

Traffic is your greatest concern. Make sure you check to the front sides and rear before doing an exercise. Also, make sure you watch out for children and animals and be considerate of others in the area.

Safety Rules

The practice exercises are not dangerous. However, a few safety rules should be followed:

- Wear proper protective clothing to include: helmet, gloves, boots or shoes that cover the ankles, long pants, and long-sleeved shirt or jacket.
- Inspect the motorcycle for defects before you start. If you are not familiar with the inspection procedures for your motorcycle, check the owner's manual.
- Check the practice area for loose gravel, glass, grease left by cars, or other things that could cause a spill.
- If possible, take a friend along to: (a) Watch out for traffic, & (b) Help you if anything goes wrong.

What to Bring

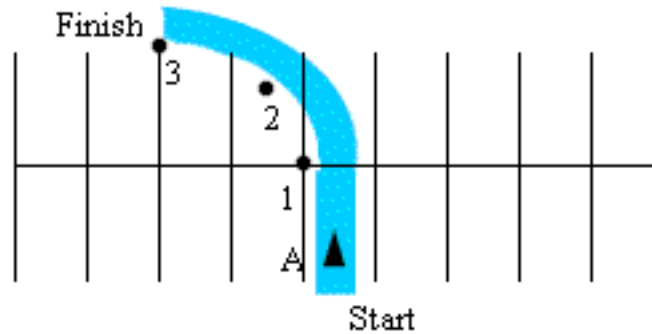
Bring five small objects that you can use as markers. Milk cartons or plastic bottles with a little sand or water in the bottom work well. If you use small objects, bring some chalk to draw markers on the pavement.

Exercise 1: Quick Stop on a Curve

Directions

Practicing this exercise will help you stop quickly when something suddenly appears in your path on a curve.

Ride to the outside of the line "A". Start, facing marker one at a distance sufficient enough to increase speed to 10-15 mph. As you reach marker one, turn in the curved path indicated by marker two, three, and four. When your front tire passes marker two, begin braking. Try to stop before marker three. Do this at 10 mph, then 15 mph. Do not exceed 15 mph.



Coaching Tips

- Keep head and eyes up; focus on where you want to go.
- Straighten motorcycle, then apply both brakes stopping as quickly as possible.
- Keep feet on pegs until almost stopped.
- When stopped, the left foot should touch the ground first, and you should be in first gear.
- Do not skid either wheel.


Problems and Corrections

1. Overshooting the final marker.
 - Apply more pressure to the brakes once motorcycle is straightened from the lean angle.
2. Motorcycle nearly falls over.
 - Straighten up the motorcycle, then apply the brakes. Be sure the handlebars are square with the motorcycle.
3. Rear wheel skids.
 - Apply less pressure on the rear brake and make sure the motorcycle is straight up.

Subject: Future Wing Dings

A rumor has been circulating at the last two rally's that I have attended that GWRRA has sold the "rights" to Wing Ding to the Gaylord Hotel chain and that for the next 10 years Wing Ding will rotate back and forth between Grapevine TX and Ft. Wayne IN. Can you verify this or publicly put the issue to rest. The members that have spoken to me about this are very upset.... The rumors are being circulated by a number of vendors at the rally's. Thank you for you help.

Dear _____,

There are no rights that have been sold by GWRRA to the Gaylord Properties nor is the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum in Fort Wayne, IN owned by Gaylord. The Memorial Coliseum is owned by Allen County, State of Indiana and is a War Memorial built in 1952. Any sale to anyone would require an act of the Indiana State Legislators. It is currently planned to hold Wing Ding in Nashville at the Opryland Hotel with another future Wing Ding in Grapevine, TX. However, no plans are in the mill at this point for Fort Wayne after 2005. The ANPAC Motorcycle Jubilee, which is an open rally and not that of GWRRA, has the potential of several years at the Nashville Opryland Hotel in consideration of the Drill Team Stadium that they built specifically for the annual International Drill Team Federation (IDTF) Championships. The Drill Team Competition is the primary reason for the ANPAC Motorcycle Jubilee. The first four years of the Jubilee and the competition were held in Springfield, MO at the Ozark County Fairgrounds. This was year one at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville and it is likely at this point and time that we will return to Nashville for future Jubilees. Please feel free to share this information with anyone that might be concerned. Like most rumors, those spreading usually know nothing about which they talk and all to often just like to look as if they are in the know. We greatly appreciate you taking your time to ask us about these rumors and would always encourage anyone who is concerned to merely call or write us. And, as you appropriately suggest, we will share this information with the GWRRA Officer's Network.

You've heard of Rocky Mountain Oysters. Here's an event that features a similar, more seasonal delicacy.

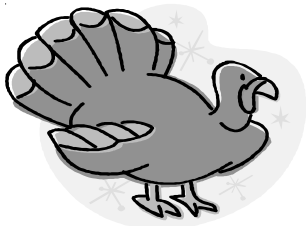
It's the annual Turkey Testicle Festival in Byron, IL, 12 miles south of Rockford. You might call these morsels Mississippi Valley Scallops. Or call them turkey fries, if it makes you more comfortable. They're deep-fried to a golden brown, then served in plastic cups.

The Turkey Testicle Festival originated in 1978 at Union St. Station in Byron, IL., "Home of the Turkey Testicle Festival". This year will be the 25th (Silver Anniversary) Annual Turkey Testicle Festival. The festival is always the 2nd Saturday in October, the first band starts around 11:00am. and the last band plays until 11:00pm. The deep fried delights start being served around noon. Sorry, no one under 21 will be admitted to the Festival.

In its first year, the festival saw a modest turnout of 50 turkey-fry fans gobble 25 pounds of the tasty treat. In the year 2000, 4,000 visitors showed up. This year, 360 pounds will be shipped from Baraboo Sysco Foods in Wisconsin.

Doughboy was buried in a lightly greased coffin.



Dozens of celebrities turned out to pay their respects, including Mrs. Butterworth, Hungry Jack, the California Raisins, Betty Crocker, the Hostess Twinkies, and Captain Crunch.

The grave site was piled high with flours. As long-time friend, Quaker Oats delivered the eulogy, describing Doughboy as a man who never knew how much he was kneaded.

Doughboy rose quickly in show business, but his later life was filled with turnovers. He was not considered a very "smart" cookie, wasting much of his dough on half-baked schemes. Despite being a little flaky at times, he even still, as a crusty old man, was considered a roll model for millions. Toward the end it was thought he would rise again, but alas, he was no tart.

Doughboy is survived by his wife, Play Dough; two children, John Dough and Jane Dough; plus they had one in the oven. He is also survived by his elderly father, Pop Tart.

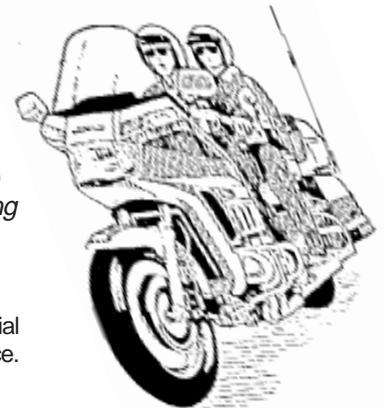
