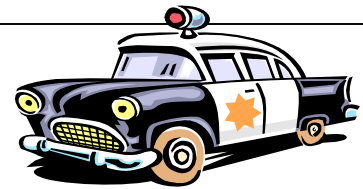

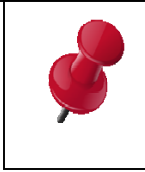

To be certain your child is safe, bring your vehicle, safety seat, and child to one of the Phoenix Police Departments installation events or call 602-495-5007 to schedule an appointment.

## Help fight graffiti correctly

Scores of neighborhood associations and businesses are helping the city in its war against graffiti by actively painting over graffiti in their areas.

However, when removing graffiti from APS or SRP utility boxes, residents **should not** do the following:

- Paint over utility box numbers – tape over numbers and pertinent information before spraying
- Spray over graffiti when the box is running – this could cause an electrical short
- Spray inside vented areas – another potential cause for an electrical short
- Paint over locks – this makes it difficult for workers to access the box
- Spray boxes that have exposed circuits – please report such boxes to APS or SRP
- Paint over sight glasses – these help the utility worker
- Paint over rusted boxes – report such boxes to APS or SRP

Taking these small steps will ensure utility workers and residents are kept out of harm's way.

## SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH

Are you and your family prepared for a major disaster or attack? Despite such catastrophic events as hurricanes and terrorist attacks, about 75 percent of Americans are not prepared for similar incidents.

September marks the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's fifth annual National Preparedness Month, which is designed to raise public awareness of the importance of family emergency planning. The city's Office of Emergency Management reminds you there are simple steps you can take to prepare your family for an emergency.

These steps include assembling an emergency supply kit, developing an emergency family plan, being informed of potential threats that may affect your family and getting involved in your community's preparedness efforts. Emergency supply kits typically include basic items such as water and food, prescription medications, as well as a battery-powered radio and a first aid kit.

Emergency family plans should be developed with your family's unique needs in mind. Residents can become more actively involved in their community's preparedness efforts by joining their local Citizens Corps Council and participating in the preparation, training, and participation in community exercises and assisting local emergency responders.
