Norman, OK – Norman small businessman Chebon Marshall announced his candidacy today to serve as Ward 2 City Councilman. “I believe I can run a campaign that energizes people from all walks of life and challenges them to believe in what we can be as a City,” said Marshall. “There is much to be done, and this election will be about important issues critical to our future.”

Marshall said that he believes the old battles must be set aside for new progress. “To meet the struggles we face, we must be inclusive in our approach to them.
