Dorothea Dix (1802-1887)

Released: 9/23/83

Scott: 1844

Superintendent of nurses during the Civil War. Led drive to improve mental institutions until she was 80 years old.

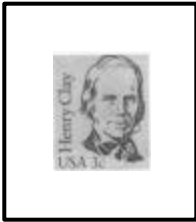


Igor Stravinsky (1882-1971)

Released: 11/18/82

Scott: 1845

Russian born composer. Became best known for opera classics. He became a U.S. Citizen in 1945.



Henry Clay (1777-1852)

Released: 7/13/83

Scott: 1846

Compromised on the issue of slavery between northern and southern states. Ran for president unsuccessfully 5 times.



Carl Schurz (1829-1906)

Released: 6/33/83

Scott: 1847

German born leader in anti-slavery fight. Worked for Lincoln. His wife started the first kindergarten in the U.S.



Pearl Buck (1892-1973)

Released: 6/25/83

Scott: 1848

Author who wrote 65 books. She won the Nobel prize for literature. Her books were about the people of China.



Walter Lippman (1889-1974)

Released: 9/19/85

Scott: 1849

Journalist for the N.Y. Herald Tribune. Wrote a column called 'Today and Tomorrow'. 200 Newspapers carried it.

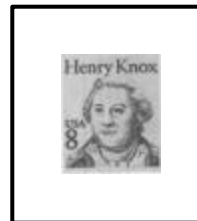


Abraham Baldwin (1754-1807)

Released: 1/25/85

Scott: 1850

Signed the Constitution. Founded University of Georgia. Served in House of Representatives and U.S. Senate.



Henry Knox (1750-1806)

Released: 7/25/85

Scott: 1851

American Revolutionary War General. First Secretary of War. Directed troops across the Delaware River in 1776.



Sylvanus Thayer (1785-1872)

Released: 6/7/85

Scott: 1852

Father of West Point. Served as Superintendent from 1817 until 1833. He was a U.S. Army Engineer.

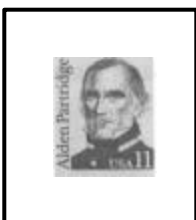


Richard Russell (1897-1971)

Released: 5/31/84

Scott: 1853

Governor and U.S. Senator from Georgia. Served as Chairman of the Senate Armed Forces Committee.



Alden Partridge (1785-1854)

Released: 2/12/85

Scott: 1854

Acting Superintendent of West Point 1815-17. Founder of Norwich University in Vermont in 1819. 'Citizen's Soldier'.



Crazy Horse (1844-1877)

Released: 1/15/82

Scott: 1855

An Oglala Sioux Indian Chief. He led several battles against the U.S. He had a quiet manner with 'unusual powers'.
