Virginia Apgar, M.D.

Released: 10/24/94

Scott: 2179

Developed way to determine baby's health at birth. Appearance, Pulse, Grimace, Activity, Respiration. APGAR



Chester Carlson

Released: 10/21/88

Scott: 2180

He was a Physicist that invented xerography (dry writing) in 1938.



Mary Cassatt (1844-1926)

Released: 11/4/88

Scott: 2181

Painter who drew pictures of people engaged in ordinary activities, particularly with women and children.



Jack London (1876-1916)

Released: 1/11/88

Scott: 2182

An American Author and Social Activist. Wrote '*Call of the Wild*', '*White Fang*' and '*Sea Wolf*'



Sitting Bull (1834-1890)

Released: 9/14/89

Scott: 2183

Famous medicine man. Was involved in many wars in the 1800's, including the Battle of Bighorn.



Earl Warren (1891-1974)

Released: 3/9/92

Scott: 2184

Served as Chief Justice of the U.S. from 1953-1969. He was chairman of the JFK assassination investigation.



Thomas Jefferson (1743-1826)

Released: 4/13/93

Scott: 2185

President and author of the Declaration of Independence. He was a diplomat and founder of the Democratic Party.



Dennis Chavez (1888-1962)

Released: 4/3/91

Scott: 2186

2nd Hispanic American to serve in the U.S. Senate. He was an early supporter of federal fair employment laws.



Claire Chennault (1890-1958)

Released: 9/6/90

Scott: 2187

Led the '*Flying Tigers*'. Supported China in the war against Japan prior to the U.S. involvement in the war.



Harvey Cushing, M.D. (1869-1939)

Released: 6/17/88

Scott: 2188

The world's greatest brain surgeon. As a result of his work, neurology became a respected medical sub-specialty.



Hubert Humphrey (1911-1978)

Released: 6/3/91

Scott: 2189

Served as VP under LBJ. He was the Democratic Nominee for President. He lost to Richard Nixon.



John Harvard ()

Released: 9/3/91

Scott: 2190

He was a Minister and Philanthropist who gave \$ to Harvard. The University was later named after him. Not founder.
