H.H. (Hap) Arnold (1886-1950)

Released: 11/5/88

Scott: 2191

First General of the Army Air Force, which was established in 1941 after Pearl Harbor was attacked. USMA Grad

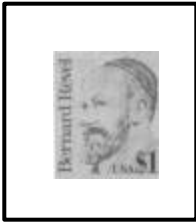


Wendell Willkie (1892-1944)

Released: 2/16/92

Scott: 2192

Republican candidate for President in 1940 when FDR ran for a 3rd term. Received 45% of the vote (22 million)



Bernard Revel

Released: 9/23/92

Scott: 2193

Builder of the American Jewish Orthodoxy. Yeshiva University was named after him.



John Hopkins (1795-1873)

Released: 6/7/89

Scott: 2194

Merchant, financier, and philanthropist. Founded John Hopkins University. Founded grocery stores and railroads.



William Jennings Bryan (1860-1925)

Released: 3/19/92

Scott: 2195

Ran unsuccessfully for President 3 times. Delivered powerful speeches at the Democratic National Conventions.



Bret Harte (1836-1902)

Released: 4/25/87

Scott: 2196

Author famous for writing stories about the West. His novels portrayed reckless and fascinating characters.



Milton Hershey (1857-1945)

Released: 9/13/95

Scott: 2933

Founded one of the worlds largest confectionary companies, Hershey Chocolate. He made it a everyday treat.

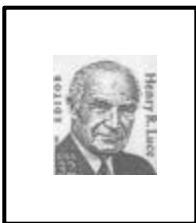


Cal Farley (1895-1967)

Released: 4/26/96

Scott: 2934

Established 'America's First Boys Ranch' in 1939, an organization designed to help troubled boys.



Henry R. Luce (1898-1967)

Released: 4/3/98

Scott: 2935

Founded *Time*, *Life* and *Fortune* Magazines. He was born in China. His parents were missionaries.



Lila and DeWitt Wallace

Released: 7/6/98

Scott: 2936

Founders of *Readers Digest*. It became a global publisher of magazines, books, and entertainment items. Philanthropist



Ruth Benedict (1887-1948)

Released: 10/20/95

Scott: 2938

As an Anthropologist, she studied human culture in relation to the formation of personalities in different societies.



Alice Hamilton, MD (1869-1970)

Released: 7/11/95

Scott: 2940

She let the efforts to improve the industrial workplace. As a result, Workers Compensation laws developed.
