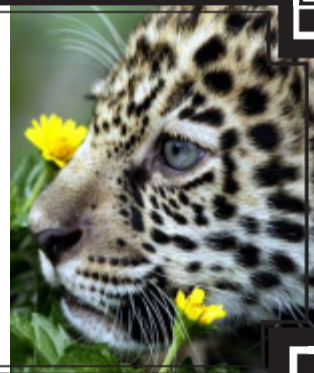

### **Marinated Shrimp with Capers and Dill**

8 First-Course Servings

- 10 T olive oil
- 1½ lb large uncooked shrimp, peeled, deveined
- 3T fresh lemon juice
- 2 T Dijon mustard
- 2 T chopped fresh dill
- 2 lg. cloves garlic
- 1 T grated lemon peel
- ¼ c drained capers
- 2 green onions sliced thin
- 1 head butter lettuce
- 1 lemon cut in thin rounds and dill springs for garnish

The food, was wonderful as usual. Cam demonstrated his fancy new grill, which produced wonder-

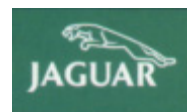

**Ratan Tata**, Charman of Jaguar parent company Tata Motors. A Graduate of Cornell in Architecture and Cheshire cat impersonator; took time away from his “Fata Nano publicity, to talk about Jaguar. He believes Jaguar must use image projects like the new roadster to “show a new face when demand for a new wave of more efficient luxury returns. “Putting exciting projects on the back burner is the thing we should not, do”, said Tata.

“Certainly we must attend to business by doing our utmost to cut costs and reduce time-frames, but above all we must ensure that we come out of this slump ahead of where we were — with exciting cars like the roadster that show where we want to go.”

The Jaguar C-XE, as reported previously will be shown as a concept soon but has been confirmed as a production car. Artist rendering of the C-XE and the C-XJ concept car will become production cars before the year is over.

The radical new Jaguar XJ will be revealed in London this July ahead of its launch later this year, and Jaguar wants to reclaim some of its traditional executive customer with the car. Project X351, as the car is called, started as a reskin of the current XJ. But as the programme has developed, the engineering changes have become more extensive. Expect the launch in Frankfurt in September as reported in our last issue.

To get to the mission, take highway 246 from Buellton west towards Lompoc. After 15 miles or thereabouts, you will see the La Purisima Golf Course on your right. After perhaps another mile, and immediately after Cebada Canyon Road, you will take the right fork towards Vandenberg Air Force Base, then get ready to make a right turn into the mission parking lot. Once parked, walk to the picnic area just beyond the parking lot and past the buildings on your right.

Bring a dish to share (**Pat Bivans** will be coordinating this), your drinks and utensils, a table cloth, and a folding chair if you wish. Hope to see you there.

Heat 2 T oil on medium high heat, sprinkle shrimp with salt and pepper. Cook until just opaque in center (about 3 minutes). Transfer to plate.

Whisk next 5 ingredients, whisk in 8 T oil and season with salt and pepper. Mix in shrimp and pan juices, capers and green onions. Cool then refrigerate for a least 3 hours or up to one day.

Serve on butter lettuce. Garnish with lemon thins and dill sprigs.
